Discussion: Though several cases of nephritis were treated in the all stages by us few are mentioned above. These cases however responded to Usani treatment slowly but steadily to a complete recovery. If the disease and its stage are diagnosed according to the temperament of the patient, and if the medicine which is having the action on the diseased organ possessing the same degree of the opposite temperament of the disease, is prescribed, there should be the correct desired action.

The kidney water are then passed into extra-calculary
 ducts which are the ducts of the sweat glands which surround
 the kidney. This extra-calculary duct has its own carrier

 in the wall of the duct. Therefore
 substances which are soluble in water and their
 salts, sugar, alcohol, drugs, vitamins etc.
 are excreted in this duct. If all these are
 excreted, the whole system of body would not break
 and the kidney would not be affected. If the kidney is
 not able to excrete the waste matter, it will play the part
 of a poison to the body.

The last item of the 5th-sarvangas/ the six
 is described by them as follows, is fulfilled by
 the excretion of the waste matter of the body and
 (the waste matter and retention) which maintains it
 able to life is carried out by these kidneys and if it
 is not done for a few hours, life would be
